# Can You Guess My Name?

Here are some of the plants we can grow here in the Pacific Northwest. We've arranged them by the time of year they bloom or grow (some bloom in more than one season). Do you know the names of all these plants? See how many you can name! Hint: They go from easy to hard in each season.















Hint: These flowers may look similar to roses, but they aren't related and have a different name. Hint: This shrub blooms in early spring and is also called the lily-of-the-valley shrub.



### Summer









Hint: This plant is sometimes used as an herbal remedy in teas to help fight colds.



Hint: A girl's name and an eye color are parts of this plant's name.

## Fall











Hint: Did you know this plant is in the same botanical family as sunflowers and lettuce? The family is called *Asteraceae* and gives a hint to the plant's name.



Hint: This plant is called a succulent, which means it has fat, leathery leaves that store water.

## Winter













Hint: This is one of two very similar plants. One has a girl's name and the other (this one) a shortened version of that same name. This plant blooms in winter and has needle-like leaves. Hint: The stalks on these flowers often curl themselves into spirals.
